

Join Us in Adoration to End Abortion

Join Catholics across the country in Eucharistic adoration on December 1, when the Supreme Court hears the landmark pro-life case, *Dobbs vs Jackson Women's Health*.

What is "Dobbs"?

The full name of the case is *Thomas E. Dobbs, State Health Officer of the Mississippi Department of Health, et al. v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, et al.*, but most people call it "*Dobbs v. Jackson*" or simply "*Dobbs*."

In the *Dobbs* case, the Supreme Court has to decide the constitutionality of a 2018 state law that bans most abortions after 15 weeks of gestation in Mississippi.

What does "Dobbs" have to do with the pro-life movement?

Abortion groups have challenged Mississippi's 2018 pro-life law ever since it passed, pointing out that it seems to violate the "constitutional right to abortion" guaranteed by *Roe v. Wade*, the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in all 50 states.

But that's just the thing! When the Supreme Court agreed to take on *Dobbs*, everyone quickly realized what it would mean. Their ruling on *Dobbs* could amount to a ruling on the constitutionality of *Roe v. Wade* itself, together with other pro-abortion legal precedents such as the case of *Planned Parenthood v. Casey*, which further cemented the "constitutionality" of *Roe*.

Is the Supreme Court pro-life?

We can't take anything for granted, but yes, the Supreme Court of the United States currently has a majority of five Justices who are widely considered to be pro-life — including the three justices added during the Trump administration.

In fact, Justice Clarence Thomas has even openly called for the Supreme Court to consider striking down *Roe* as wrongly decided.

What do the people at the center of the "Dobbs" case think?

They couldn't be more opposite! *Jackson Women's Health Organization* believes that *Roe v. Wade* is sacred and must always remain the law of the land. Mississippi officials, on the other hand, have openly called on the Supreme Court to repeal *Roe*. Mississippi Attorney General Lynn Fitch called *Roe* "egregiously wrong," and officially requested that the high Court return the abortion issue to the states, where the people and their own elected lawmakers would be able to pass pro-life laws to protect the unborn.
